Qualified offer of settlement: inadmissible per Rule 408 of the Ind. Rules of Evidence. IDEM asserts that any offer to compromise a claim or any acceptance of such offer does not bind or obligate the parties of this enforcement action in the absence of a final order of the agency.

IDEM conducted an investigation of Keener Metal Fabricating, LLC and has made a preliminary determination that violations of environmental management laws and rules exist. Per IC 13-30-3-3, enclosed please find a Notice of Violation that sets forth the alleged violations and a proposed Agreed Order which constitutes a qualified offer of settlement.

You may request a settlement conference to discuss the allegations and the actions necessary to correct and resolve the violations, which may include injunctive relief and the establishment of a compliance schedule. Payment of a civil penalty will also be discussed. The civil penalty amount noted in the proposed Agreed Order contains a preliminary penalty figure for settlement discussion purposes only and is based on penalty calculations associated with the alleged violations set forth in the Notice of Violation. A portion of the civil penalty may be offset by performing an approved Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP). Typical SEPs have included pollution prevention, pollution control, and environmental restoration projects. A copy of IDEM's SEP policy may be obtained from this office or at IDEM's website at www.IN.gov/idem.

The individual signing the enclosed Agreed Order should be fully authorized to execute the document and legally bind the parties. The timely entry into an Agreed Order, which saves you and IDEM time and resources, may lead to a reduction in the civil penalty.

IDEM is not required to extend the offer of entry into an Agreed Order for more than 60 days. You may enter into an Agreed Order without admitting that the violations occurred. Additionally, to encourage a timely agreement, IDEM may offer a one time twenty percent reduction (20%) to the Civil Penalty for 60 days after receipt of this Notice of Violation.

If an Agreed Order is not entered into, IDEM may proceed to issue a unilateral notice and order requiring compliance with the environmental laws, rules, and/or permit, including payment of a civil penalty. Pursuant to Indiana Code ("IC") 13-30-3-3, the Indiana Department of Environmental Management ("IDEM") issues this Notice of Violation. Based on an investigation including an inspection conducted on September 15, 2021, by an IDEM representative, IDEM has reason to believe Keener Metal Fabricating, LLC ("Respondent") violated environmental statutes and rules. The violations are based on the following:

1. Respondent is Keener Metal Fabricating, LLC, which owns/operates the facility, with EPA ID No. IND990735219, located at 419 East 10th Street, in Connersville, Fayette County, Indiana ("Site").
2. 329 Indiana Administrative Code ("IAC") 3.1 incorporates certain federal hazardous waste management requirements found in 40 Code of Federal Regulations ("CFR") Parts 260 through 270 and Part 273, including those identified below.
3. Pursuant to 40 CFR 262.11(a), a person who generates a solid waste must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste at the point of waste generation, before any dilution, mixing, or other alteration of the waste occurs, and at any time in the course of its management that it has, or may have, changed its properties as a result of exposure to the environment or other factors that may change the properties of the waste such that the RCRA classification of the waste may change.

As noted during the inspection, Respondent did not make a hazardous waste determination on waste paint filters and used light bulbs, which are solid wastes generated by Respondent.

4. Pursuant to 329 IAC 3.1-1-10, every hazardous waste generator, transporter, or owner or operator of a hazardous waste facility shall notify the commissioner of its hazardous waste activity on the approved forms.

As noted during the inspection, Respondent failed to notify the Commissioner of hazardous waste generator activities. Specifically, Respondent last notified as a very small quantity generator in 2002 but operated as a small quantity generator in 2020.

5. Pursuant to IC 13-22-4-3.1(b), a hazardous waste small quantity generator (SQG), i.e., a person that generates, in any one or more calendar months of a calendar year:
- more than one hundred (100) kilograms but less than one thousand (1,000) kilograms of hazardous waste;
 - less than one (1) kilogram of acute hazardous waste; or
 - less than one hundred (100) kilograms of material from the cleanup spillage of acute hazardous waste; or

accumulates at least one thousand (1,000) kilograms of hazardous waste or less than one (1) kilogram of acute hazardous waste shall, before March 1 of each year, submit to the department on forms provided by the department, a report that summarizes the person's hazardous waste shipments during the previous calendar year.

Respondent generated at SQG levels in 2020 and should have submitted a 2020 annual manifest report by March 1, 2021.

A review of IDEM records pertaining to the Site revealed that, as of December 20, 2021, Respondent had not submitted a 2020 annual manifest report.

6. Pursuant to 40 CFR 262.15(a)(4), a container holding hazardous waste must be closed at all times during accumulation except when adding, removing, or consolidating waste; or when temporary venting of container is necessary.

As noted during the inspection, Respondent accumulated one (1) 55-gallon container and three (3) 5-gallon containers of hazardous waste at or near the point of generation without a permit and without the containers being stored closed during accumulation.

7. Pursuant to 40 CFR 262.15(a)(5)(i), a generator must mark or label its satellite hazardous waste containers with the words "Hazardous Waste."

As noted during the inspection, Respondent accumulated one (1) 55-gallon container and three (3) 5-gallon containers of hazardous waste at or near the point of generation without a permit and did not properly mark satellite accumulation containers with the words "Hazardous Waste."

8. Pursuant to 40 CFR 262.15(a)(5)(ii), a generator must mark or label its satellite hazardous waste containers with an indication of the hazards of the contents.

As noted during the inspection, Respondent accumulated one (1) 55-gallon container and three (3) 5-gallon containers of hazardous waste at or near the point of generation without a permit and did not properly mark satellite accumulation containers with an indication of the hazards of the contents.

9. Pursuant to 329 IAC 13-4-3(d), generators must label all used oil containers and aboveground tanks with the words "Used Oil."

As noted during the inspection, Respondent did not label one (1) used oil 55-gallon container with the words "Used Oil."

Pursuant to IC 13-30-3-3, the Commissioner herein provides notice that the violations may exist and offers an opportunity to enter into an Agreed Order providing for the actions required to correct the violations and, as necessary and appropriate, for the payment of a civil penalty. The Commissioner is not required to extend this offer for more than sixty (60) days.

Pursuant to IC 13-30-3-3, an alleged violator may enter into an Agreed Order without admitting the violations occurred. IDEM encourages settlement by Agreed Order, thereby resulting in quicker correction of the environmental violations and avoidance of extensive litigation. Timely settlement by Agreed Order may result in a reduced civil penalty. Also, settlement discussions will allow Respondent the opportunity to present any mitigating factors that may be relevant to the violations.

If an Agreed Order is not entered into within sixty (60) days of receipt of this Notice of Violation, the Commissioner may issue a Notice and Order under IC 13-30-3-4 containing the actions that must be taken to correct the violations and requiring the payment of an appropriate civil penalty. Pursuant to IC 13-30-4-1, the Commissioner may assess penalties of up to \$25,000 per day for each violation.

AGREED ORDER

Complainant and Respondent desire to settle and compromise this action without hearing or adjudication of any issue of fact or law, and consent to the entry of the following Findings of Fact and Order. Pursuant to Indiana Code (“IC”) 13-30-3-3, entry into the terms of this Agreed Order does not constitute an admission of any violation contained herein. Respondent’s entry into this Agreed Order shall not constitute a waiver of any defense, legal or equitable, which Respondent may have in any future administrative or judicial proceeding, except a proceeding to enforce this order.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Complainant is the Commissioner (“Complainant”) of the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (“IDEM”), a department of the State of Indiana created by IC 13-13-1-1.
2. Respondent is Keener Metal Fabricating, LLC, which owns/operates the facility, with EPA ID No. IND990735219, located at 419 East 10th Street, in Connersville, Fayette County, Indiana (“Site”).
3. IDEM has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this action.
4. Pursuant to IC 13-30-3-3, IDEM issued a Notice of Violation (“NOV”) via Certified Mail to:

5. Respondent last notified EPA of very small quantity generator activities on April 11, 2002.
6. Respondent manufactures custom fabricated material handling containers, racks, and dunnage.
7. 329 Indiana Administrative Code ("IAC") 3.1 incorporates federal hazardous waste management requirements found in 40 Code of Federal Regulations ("CFR") Parts 260 through 270 and Part 273, including those identified below.
8. During an investigation including an inspection on September 15, 2021, conducted by a representative of IDEM, the following violations were found:
 - a. Pursuant to 40 CFR 262.11(a), a person who generates a solid waste must determine if that waste is a hazardous waste at the point of waste generation, before any dilution, mixing, or other alteration of the waste occurs, and at any time in the course of its management that it has, or may have, changed its properties as a result of exposure to the environment or other factors that may change the properties of the waste such that the RCRA classification of the waste may change.

As noted during the inspection, Respondent did not make a hazardous waste determination on waste paint filters and used light bulbs, which are solid wastes generated by Respondent.

On January 21, 2022, Respondent completed a hazardous waste determination on the waste paint filters and determined that they are nonhazardous.

- b. Pursuant to 329 IAC 3.1-1-10, every hazardous waste generator, transporter, or owner or operator of a hazardous waste facility shall notify the commissioner of its hazardous waste activity on the approved forms.

As noted during the inspection, Respondent failed to notify the Commissioner of hazardous waste generator activities. Specifically, Respondent last notified as a very small quantity generator in 2002 but operated as a small quantity generator in 2020.
- c. Pursuant to IC 13-22-4-3.1(b), a hazardous waste small quantity generator (SQG), i.e., a person that generates, in any one or more calendar months of a calendar year:
 - a) more than one hundred (100) kilograms but less than one thousand (1,000) kilograms of hazardous waste;
 - b) less than one (1) kilogram of acute hazardous waste; or

- c) less than one hundred (100) kilograms of material from the cleanup spillage of acute hazardous waste; or

accumulates at least one thousand (1,000) kilograms of hazardous waste or less than one (1) kilogram of acute hazardous waste shall, before March 1 of each year, submit to the department on forms provided by the department, a report that summarizes the person's hazardous waste shipments during the previous calendar year.

Respondent generated at SQG levels in 2020 and should have submitted a 2020 annual manifest report by March 1, 2021.

A review of IDEM records pertaining to the Site revealed that, as of December 20, 2021, Respondent had not submitted a 2020 annual manifest report.

- g. Pursuant to 329 IAC 13-4-3(d), generators must label all used oil containers and aboveground tanks with the words "Used Oil."

As noted during the inspection, Respondent did not label one (1) used oil 55-gallon container with the words "Used Oil."

9. Orders of the Commissioner are subject to administrative review by the Office of Environmental Adjudication under IC 4-21.5; however, in recognition of the settlement reached, Respondent acknowledges notice of this right and waives any right to administrative and judicial review of this Agreed Order.

II. ORDER

1. This Agreed Order shall be effective ("Effective Date") when it is approved by Complainant or Complainant's delegate and has been received by Respondent. This Agreed Order shall have no force or effect until the Effective Date.
2. Respondent shall comply with the statutes and rules listed in the findings of fact above.
3. Within thirty (30) days of the Effective Date, Respondent shall conduct a hazardous waste determination on the used light bulbs.
4. Within forty-five (45) days of the Effective Date, Respondent shall submit documentation that the requirements in Order paragraph #3 have been completed.
5. Within thirty (30) days of the Effective Date, Respondent shall notify IDEM of its current hazardous waste generator activities via RCRAinfo.epa.gov. Instructions can be found here: [IDEM: Managing Waste: How to Obtain a New RCRA ID Number](#).
6. Within thirty (30) days of the Effective Date, Respondent shall submit the 2020 annual report (due March 2021). Instructions can be found here: <https://www.in.gov/idem/waste/resources/applications-and-forms/annual-report-and-biennial-report/>.
7. Immediately upon the Effective Date, Respondent shall ensure that containers are closed and properly marked/labeled as required by 40 CFR 262.15 and 329 IAC 13-4-3(d).
8. All submittals required by this Agreed Order, unless IDEM notifies Respondent otherwise in writing, shall be sent to:

9. Pursuant to IC 13-30-4-1, Respondent is assessed and agrees to pay a civil penalty of Five Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$5,750). Respondent shall pay by the due date printed on the Invoice, as attached.

10. In the event the terms and conditions of the following paragraphs are violated, Complainant may assess and Respondent shall pay stipulated penalties in the following amounts:

3	\$250 per week
4	\$100 per week
5	\$100 per week
6	\$100 per week

11. Stipulated penalties shall be due and payable no later than the thirtieth day after Respondent receives written notice that Complainant has determined a stipulated penalty is due; the thirtieth day being the "Due Date." Complainant may notify Respondent at any time that a stipulated penalty is due. Failure to notify Respondent in writing in a timely manner of a stipulated penalty assessment shall not waive Complainant's right to collect such stipulated penalty or preclude Complainant from seeking additional relief against Respondent for violation of this Agreed Order. Neither assessment nor payment of stipulated penalties shall preclude Complainant from seeking additional relief against Respondent for a violation of this Agreed Order; such additional relief includes any remedies or sanctions available pursuant to Indiana law, including, but not limited to, civil penalties pursuant to IC 13-30-4.
12. In the event that the monies due to IDEM pursuant to this Agreed Order are not paid on or before their Due Date, Respondent shall pay an additional penalty of 10 percent,

- payable to the "Environmental Management Special Fund," and shall be payable to IDEM in the manner specified in Paragraph 9, above.
13. Signatories to this Agreed Order certify that they are fully authorized to execute this Agreed Order and legally bind the party they represent.
 14. This Agreed Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent and all successors and assigns. Respondent shall provide a copy of this Agreed Order, if in force, to any subsequent owners, successors, or assigns before ownership rights are transferred.
 15. No change in ownership, corporate, or partnership status of Respondent shall in any way alter the Respondent's status or responsibilities under this Agreed Order.
 16. Respondent shall ensure that all contractors, firms, and other persons performing work under this Agreed Order comply with the terms of this Agreed Order.
 17. In the event that any terms of this Agreed Order are found to be invalid, the remaining terms shall remain in full force and effect and shall be construed and enforced as if this Agreed Order did not contain the invalid terms.
 18. This Agreed Order is not and shall not be interpreted to be a permit or a modification of an existing permit. This Agreed Order, and IDEM's review or approval of any submittal made by Respondent pursuant to this Agreed Order, shall not in any way relieve Respondent of the obligation to comply with the requirements of any applicable permits or any applicable Federal or State laws or regulations.
 19. Complainant does not, by its approval of this Agreed Order, warrant or aver in any manner that Respondent's compliance with any aspect of this Agreed Order will result in compliance with the provisions of any permit, order, or any applicable Federal or State law or regulation. Additionally, IDEM or anyone acting on its behalf shall not be held liable for any costs or penalties Respondent may incur as a result of Respondent's efforts to comply with this Agreed Order.
 20. Nothing in this Agreed Order shall prevent or limit IDEM's rights to obtain penalties or injunctive relief under any applicable Federal or State law or regulation, except that IDEM may not, and hereby waives its right to seek additional civil penalties for the violations specified in the NOV.
 21. Nothing in this Agreed Order shall prevent IDEM or anyone acting on its behalf from communicating with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) or any other agency or entity about any matters relating to this enforcement action. IDEM or anyone acting on its behalf shall not be held liable for any costs or penalties Respondent may incur as a result of such communications with the U.S. EPA or any other agency or entity.
 22. This Agreed Order shall remain in effect until IDEM issues a Resolution of Case letter to Respondent.
