Dear Mr. Ison:

Re: Ison Sanitary Landfill, OPP. NO. 36-2, Jackson County

On June 17, 1983, you were notified of your need to file a description of your closed landfill with Jackson County's land recording authority. Included with that letter was an example of the type of document which should be filed.

You filed that example document with the Recorder's Office and submitted it to this office. However, please note on the copy being returned to you that the property description included in it does <u>not</u> refer to the Ison Landfill.

It is your responsibility to prepare a document which accurately describes <u>your</u> landfill and file that corrected document with the Recorder's Office. Please note that this document must comply with Rule 320 IAC 5 (SPC-18) which states:

Rule 9, Section 5: "Sanitary landfills and other disposal operations which are closed after promulgation of this regulation (320 IAC 5) shall be inspected by a designated agent. Following final acceptance by the Board or its designated agent, a detailed description, including a plan, shall be recorded by the owner or operator with the county's land recording authority. The description shall include general types and location of wastes, depth of fill, and other information of interest to potential land owners. The owner or operator shall maintain surface contours, continue periodic groundwater monitoring, and excercise any necessary control over gas or leachate produced."

Within 30 days of receipt of this notice, please submit to this office proof of having appropriately amended the deed of record as described above.
