Comments: Received a call from a man in Vigo County trying to get rid of 2 and a half 55-gallon drums of oil. He says he is disabled and low income. Someone apparently dumped the barrels behind his daughters house. He got some friends to help him get the barrels in his truck but has had to drive around with the oil in his truck. He is trying to find a place to dispose of it at no cost. OSC called the VCSWMD and left a message asking about disposal and/or toxaway day. OSC attempted to locate a disposal site and learned Anderson CATS had accepted used oil. OSC called and left a voicemail. Turns out they have discontinued this practice. OSC contacted a local contractor who arranged for a local VFD to take the barrels.
