Comments:

On June 19, 2024, Solid Waste inspector, Hayden Dayson, conducted an inspection at South Whitetail Way, Princeton, IN 47670. This inspection was carried out as a follow-up to the initial solid waste inspection on May 9, 2024. The initial inspection was for dumping of regulated demolition waste into a ravine/ creek at the previously mentioned address.

Upon arrival the inspector observed the area had changed. The dirt row that ran along the western side of the area that was filled with painted brick/ concrete debris, rebar, piping, railroad ties, and plastic culvert pieces was no longer there. A large mixed dirt pile containing broken concrete slabs, brick, and rebar was present. However, no painted concrete or brick was observed in this pile. An excavator sat next to this pile as well (Photos 3-8).

On the eastern side of the site, the large dirt pile seen previously was still present. However, no regulated waste was observed mixed in the pile (Photos 1- 2). An excavator sat on this pile as well.

The inspector then walked down a path that was made by the excavators to see further down into the ravine. While walking down, the inspector observed plastic piping, and plastic culvert pieces in the dirt. At the bottom the inspector observed concrete slabs, cinderblocks, and scrap wood pieces. It was at this time the inspector looked over the cascading slope from all the mixed dirt that had been dumped on the site. The inspector observed black plastic tarping, scrap metals, plastic culvert pieces, and broken concrete pieces (Photos 9-13).

The inspection concluded at this time.

DESCRIPTION OF VIOLATIONS

IC 13-30-2-1 (1), (3), (4), (5): A person may not allow the deposit of contaminants or solid waste upon the land or into the environment.

329 IAC 10-4-2: No person shall cause or allow the storage, contaminant, processing, or disposal of solid waste in a manner which creates a threat to human health or the environment, including the creating of a fire hazard, vector, attraction, air or water pollution, or other contamination.

329 IAC 10-4-3, 329 IAC 10-4-4: Open dumps are prohibited and must be remediated.

Violation Details: At the time of inspection, this inspector observed construction/demolition debris, rebar, plastic culvert pieces, and painted brick/concrete waste mixed with dirt and dumped on the ground throughout the property.

Required Action: It is the responsibility of the property owner to ensure that all dumping is stopped immediately and that the solid waste is removed and disposed of properly at a state approved solid waste management facility. Failure to do so will result in continued noncompliance with the Indiana rules regarding open dumping and may result in a referral to IDEM's Office of Land Enforcement. Documentation of proper disposal must be provided to the IDEM Solid Waste Compliance Inspector.

Please note that Indiana's Air Pollution Control Rule 326 IAC 4-1 prohibits the open burning of this waste. Section 5 of this rule states, "Any person who allows the accumulation or existence of combustible material which constitutes or contributes to a fire causing air pollution shall not be excused from the responsibility thereof on the basis that the fire was set by vandals, accidental or an act of God." Any burning of this waste may subject you to legal action.

A follow-up inspection will be conducted in **30 days** from receipt of this report.

Confidential Information

In accordance with 329 IAC 6.1 (http://www.in.gov/legislative/iac/T03290/A00061.PDF) a person submitting information to the department for which confidential treatment is requested shall make a written claim of confidentiality at the time of submittal of the information. A person may request confidential treatment of information at the time the information is acquired through the actions of the department, such as inspections. The written claim for confidential treatment may be broad, but must be sufficiently clear to allow for accurate identification of the information claimed to be confidential. In accordance with 329 IAC 6.1-4-1(d), supporting information must be submitted to the commissioner within five (5) working days from the time the information claimed as confidential is acquired by the department. A person submitting a claim of confidentiality shall designate and segregate the information and the supporting information to which the claim applies in a manner that is sufficiently clear to allow the department to identify all confidential claim materials. Confidential information may include (but is not limited to) written or printed material, maps, charts, photographs, or samples (see definition of information at 329 IAC 6.1-2-8). The undersigned Owner/Representative has alleged information acquired during this inspection \Box **does not** (check one) contain confidential information. A check in the "does" box is not a written claim for confidential treatment of information acquired during this inspection.

Notice of Oral Report

In accordance with IC 13-14-5 an oral report of the inspection was provided to the undersigned Owner/Agent at the conclusion of the inspection. The oral report includes any specific matters discovered during the inspection that the IDEM representative believes may be a violation of a law or of a permit issued by the department. The report does not include matters not evident to the IDEM representative or any fact that indicates an intentional, a knowing, or a reckless violation.
