

DRINKING WATER WARNING
E. coli is Present in the water of
New Hope Baptist Church
BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE DRINKING OR USING

Our water system has exceeded the *E. coli* MCL standard set by the Revised Total Coliform Rule. As our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did to correct this situation. We collected a routine sample on May 14, 2024 and repeat samples on June 17, 2024. Among these samples one or more has tested positive for *E. coli*. We are now conducting additional sampling to determine the extent of the problem and are conducting thorough investigation to determine the source of the contamination.

What should I do? Do not drink the water without boiling it first. Bring all water to a rolling boil, let it boil for at least three minutes, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation until subsequent sampling results show we are in compliance. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.

E. coli are bacteria whose presence indicates that the water maybe contaminated with human or animal waste. Human pathogens in these wastes can cause short-term effects, such as diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms. They may pose a greater health risk for infants, young children, the elderly, and people with severely compromised immune systems.

The symptoms above are not caused only by organisms in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice. People at increased risk should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers.

What happened? What is being done? Explain below.

We will inform you when tests show no bacteria and you no longer need to boil your water. We anticipate resolving the problem within 2 weeks.
