Dear Mr. Weinzapfel:

In accordance with permit condition A3 for the referenced facility, Republic Services is herein providing written notification pertaining to a recent occurrence at the Walnut Creek Landfill. The occurrence also requires the permit holder to notify IDEM's Emergency Response (ER) line (888)-233-7745 if the event "requires the response of the local fire department." On Thursday August 10, 2023, at approximately 7:30 PM, the site Environmental Manager (EM) received telephone notice that a fire had occurred in an area of the active face. The site operations manager made telephone notifications to the ER line to report the incident. The following paragraphs provide more specific details of this occurrence.

The fire department was on site prior to the landfill staff. There were 8 fire engines on site (4 at the front gate and 4 near the fire location). The fire was identified as surficial and was approximately 30-feet by 100-feet in size, located on the east slope (north end) of Cell 5, and was approximately 40-feet above the bottom liner. Figure 1 shows the location of the fire incident. As soon as the site was notified of the fire, landfill staff were reported to the facility to aid. Landfill staff and the site Operations Manager (OM) arrived at the site around 7:30 PM and 8:30 PM EST, respectively.

The site was able to extinguish the fire by using a bulldozer to push the hot load down slope and smother it with soil. No water was used to extinguish the fire except a small amount to extinguish waste clinging to the dozer blade after the site had spread and covered the burning debris. The fire department left the site at approximately 8:30 PM EST. Landfill staff and OM remained on site for 2 hours to monitor the extinguished waste for smoke or visible hot spots. No flare ups occurred in that time frame, and the staff and OM left the site at approximately 10:30 PM EST.



# Sustainability in Action

Due to the appropriate response and actions taken by landfill personnel, the fire was quickly extinguished, no injuries occurred, and there was no imminent endangerment to the environment. No landfill gas features were near the area and no bottom liner was damaged during the incident. Landfill staff investigated for possible sources of the fire and after such it was concluded the exact cause of the fire is unknown.

The site EM notified the site's Solid Waste Inspector Jerry Jackson on August 11, 2023, via telephone. Permit condition A3 also indicates the notice should discuss "actions" taken or planned to correct the event and prevent its recurrence." In this situation Republic Services believes the existing landfill policies, procedures, and personnel response were appropriate and effective for the situation and no additions, alterations, or revisions to the site's emergency response actions are needed. Nonetheless, we will share the information with our site personnel and continue to implement existing load inspection procedures and best management practices.


