# COALMONT, CLAY COUNTY WASTEWATER AGREED ORDER PROPOSED COMPLIANCE PLAN JANUARY 2023

#### I. GENERAL

This Compliance Plan has been prepared pursuant to an Agreed Order (Case No. 2022-28798-W) between the Indiana Department of Environmental Management and the Clay County Commissioners. This Compliance Plan specifically addresses the deficiencies and violations described in the Agreed Order as follows:

- A. Evaluate and implement a means to eliminate unpermitted discharges from the Site and minimize their environmental impact.
- B. Apply for and obtain any necessary permits, which may include a construction permit and/or NPDES permit from IDEM, or approval from the Indiana State Department of Health.
- C. A schedule for securing financing for the project.
- D. A construction plan, which includes an implementation and completion schedule, including specific milestone dates.

#### II. TASK DESCRIPTION AND COMPLETION

A. Evaluate and implement a means to eliminate unpermitted discharges from the Site and minimize their environmental impact.

The County Commissioners intend to file a petition to form a Regional Sewer District (RSD) for Coalmont. Following formation of a RSD, a Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) will be completed for USDA Rural Development to evaluate alternatives to eliminate the unpermitted discharges from the site and minimize their environmental impact. The anticipated plan is a new wastewater collection system within Coalmont and a new force main to pump the wastewater flows to the City of Jasonville for wastewater treatment (It should be noted that a PER for Coalmont was developed under an agreement with the Indiana Finance Authority given a correlated project to connect Shakamak State Park to the City of Jasonville, so some work to develop a solution for Coalmont/Clay County's violations has been completed). Upon approval

of a PER, design plans and specifications will be completed and submitted to IDEM for the necessary permits. Once a permit is obtained and bids have been received, the project shall be constructed and implemented to fully address the Agreed Order.

B. Apply for and obtain any necessary permits, which may include a construction permit and/or NPDES permit from IDEM, or approval from the Indiana State Department of Health.

After completion of a PER and approval by the funding agencies, design plans and specifications for the project will be completed. Upon completion of the plans and specifications, a construction permit application will be submitted to IDEM. The construction permit will allow Clay County to construct the proposed wastewater improvements. An NPDES permit is not anticipated to be needed, since the proposed plan for wastewater treatment is regionalization with the City of Jasonville, which is contingent upon Shakamak connecting to the City, a project which is anticipated to begin construction in the second half of 2023.

C. A schedule for securing financing for the project.

The attached Compliance Plan includes a schedule for coordination with the anticipated funding agencies and securing financing. It's anticipated that multiple funding agencies will be utilized for this project.

D. A construction plan, which includes an implementation and completion schedule, including specific milestone dates.

Once the design plans and specifications are approved by IDEM and the construction permit has been issued, a bid opening for the construction of the wastewater improvements will be held. Upon approval of the bids by Clay County (and/or a Regional Sewer District) and the funding agencies, construction of the proposed improvements will begin. A detailed schedule with milestone dates for the implementation and completion of the project is included in the attached Compliance Plan schedule.

## III. COMPLIANCE SCHEDULE

The compliance schedule on the following page is anticipated. It should be noted that some components of the schedule are contingent upon funding availability and agency review times. In accordance with the Agreed Order, the Clay County Commissioners shall submit to IDEM a written progress report within 10 days of the end of each calendar quarter, which identifies the compliance actions implemented during each quarter ending on March 31st, June 30th, September 30th, and December 31st until completion of the Compliance Plan.
